



The Past Simple Tense (also called the simple past tense)





The Past Simple with 'be'

Positive with 'be'	Negative with 'be'	Negative Short Form
I was cold	I was not sleepy	I wasn't sleepy
you were tired	you were not on the bus	you weren't on the bus

he wasn't at school he was not at school

he was in the garden she was late she was not beautiful she wasn't beautiful

it wasn't cold it was not cold it was sunny

we were on holiday we were not at work we weren't at work

they were hungry they were not tired

they weren't tired

Regular Verbs – remain the same, but we add "ed"

The final ED pronunciation


Words that end in a vowel sound use the /d/ pronunciation for ED. e.g. -- followed -- enjoyed -- played -- tried -- continued



The pronunciation of words ending in ED depends on the final consonant sound. There are three ways to pronounce ED at the end of a word in English:



He cleaned his room.	He did not clean the roo m.	He didn't clean the room.

What are signal words for the Simple Past?

→ These words tell you what tense you have to use. For the Simple Past these are expressions of time in the past:

yesterday last week a month ago in 2010 this morning
